

Items to bring

LOTOJA is an all weather race. Be prepared for everything and anything. The LOTOJA organizers **may** provide you with a lunch snack and drink to take along. You will probably want to bring additional snacks and drinks.

- Official LOTOJA Shirt
- 1 Mobile or Handheld Radio with external antenna
- Extra radio or handheld (needed for neutral support)
- Extra Batteries
- Frequency lists
- LOTOJA race bible
- Note pad
- Pens
- Snacks and drink
- Money for gas, snacks and food.
- Tape (to attach race signs to vehicle)
- Vehicle insurance information
- Drivers License

Recommended

- Coat or Jacket, all weather clothes
- Hat and sun screen
- First aid kit
- Small tools kit
- Bike pump
- Blanket
- Pillow
- Scanner
- Lawn chairs (feed zone)
- Extra batteries
- FRS radio
- APRS tracker
 - Flashing Yellow light
 - Take lots of pictures

LOTOJA Check list

Use this checklist the night before to make sure you have everything.

- Vehicle fueled and ready to go
- Radio equipment installed
- Radio manuals
- Frequencies and PL tones programmed
- Frequency lists, Race Bible, operating instructions
- Wheels loaded (neutral support & rovers)
- Lunch, Snacks, Drinks
- Signs on vehicle
- White boards, signs (feed zones, corners)
- Gas and food money
- Note pad, pens, etc
- Clothing, coats etc.
- Alarm clock set
- A Good nights rest

It is highly recommended that Neutral Support Vehicles pick up wheels on the Friday Evening of the race at Sunrise Cyclery. White boards, Shirts and other supplies are usually handed out on the Thursday evening before LOTOJA at the BARC pot luck dinner.

LOTOJA starts at Sunrise Cyclery. 138 North 100 East. This is near the fire station.

After crossing the finish line or upon finishing your primary responsibility, you should contact net control for an additional assignment. Amateurs who continue all the way to Jackson should help until released by net control or at the completion of the event (around 8:00 PM) Check in with the finish line to determine drop off points for wheels and collected items. Check out with Net Control so we know you are off the race route.

FEED ZONE CUTOFF TIMES.

Cyclists that fall behind the following cutoff times will either be passed off to their Support Crew or pulled from the event:

- Feed Zone 1, Preston, ID - cutoff time is 10:15 AM
- Feed Zone 3, Montpelier, ID - cutoff time is 1:45 PM
- Feed Zone 5, Afton, WY - cutoff time is 4:30 PM
- Feed Zone 6, Alpine, WY - cutoff time is 6:00 PM

LOTOJA is not weather dependent; prepare to ride in all weather conditions.

*Every LOTOJA Start Pack will have a neutral roll-out from the Start Line to 1000 West. The roll-outs are escorted by the Logan City Police Department and will not exceed 20 m.p.h.
